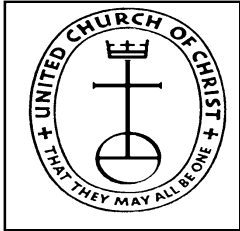

Peggy Gilbert: (Friend of Tona Griggs) is battling aggressive breast cancer.

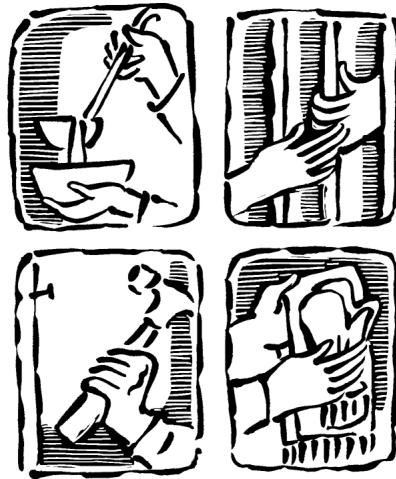
Josephine Walker: (Jeanne Kruger's mother) is at Magnolia Square, Room 228, 502 W. Edgewood (65807).

Holly Francis: (Logan McCuiston's mother) There is a ray of hope since, as of her last visit to the doctor, 75% of the cancer is gone.

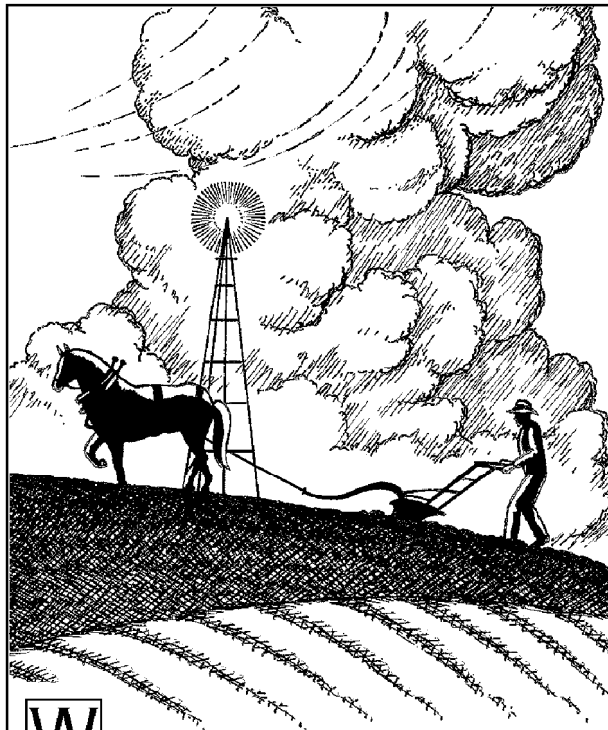
Suane Sutherland: CloElla's sister, is battling continuing pain and disability as a result of years of Rheumatoid Arthritis but is feeling a little better now..
